★ Reminders:

- On Wednesday, April 2, St. Stephen's will have worship services at 3:45 and 6:30. Please consider joining us for worship as we walk with Christ to the cross of forgiveness. There will be meals between services starting at 4:45. This week, the PTS is serving various casseroles.
- This year St. Stephen's will once again host a book fair. We are working with a different group. Instead of Scholastic, we will be hosting an I-55 Book Fair.
